Finance

Income in membership fees amounted to 30,260. In addition, a surplus of 41,248 was received from the Cracow Conference. It was agreed that 2000 from this surplus should be redirected to assist new EU member country colleagues to attend future conferences. The increased income from membership fees and the 2005 conference, along with a reduction in travel costs, resulted in a transfer to the reserve of 7320. The Treasurer forecast a return to normal conditions for the following year with a small profit budgeted for 2006-2007.

Publication

Two issues of Re*CALL* were distributed via Cambridge University Press. These were also made available to subscribers electronically by password access.

Accounts from CUP showed that a small net surplus had been generated in the calendar year 2005, with an encouraging forecast of a further surplus in 2006. The Editorial Board for the year 2005-2006 is listed below:

Regional representatives

National/regional representatives act as contacts in their own particular regions, setting up local websites to stimulate relevant activity locally and to promote membership of EUROCALL. The representatives meet annually at the conference to share ideas and are co-ordinated by Peppi Taalas, who is also a member of the EUROCALL Executive Committee.

Conference

Another successful annual conference was held in August 2005 at Jagiellonian University, Cracow, Poland, organised by Grazyna Studzinska. A selection of papers from the conference was published in Re*CALL* volume 18.

The Annual EUROCALL Research Award

There were no applicants for the Research Award for 2005.

The János Kohn Scholarship

There were no applicants from Hungary for the Scholarship for 2005. It was agreed by the Executive Committee that the scholarship should be extended to include applicants from new EU member states from 2006.
