Finance

Income from membership fees amounted to $\notin 23,210$. A surplus of $\notin 7,262$ was received from the Coleraine Conference. Travel and other expenses had increased during the period and this resulted in a deficit of $\notin 7,684$ for the year. The Treasurer was predicting a small profit for 2008-2009 but cautioned that costs much be kept to a minimum if this were to be achieved.

Publication

Three issues of Re*CALL* were distributed via Cambridge University Press. These were also made available to subscribers electronically by password access.

Accounts from Cambridge University Press showed that a net surplus of $\notin 2,705$ had been generated in the calendar year 2007, with a forecast of a similarly modest surplus in 2008. The Editorial Board for the year 2007-2008 is listed below:

At the end of the period in question, there were 351 registered users of the discussion list, a slight increase on the previous year. The list is open to members and non-members alike and continues to be regularly used.

Regional representatives

National/regional representatives act as contacts in their own particular regions, setting up local websites to stimulate relevant activity locally and to promote membership of EUROCALL. The representatives meet annually at the conference to share ideas and are co-ordinated by Peppi Taalas, who is also a member of the EUROCALL Executive Committee.

Conference

Another successful annual conference was held in September 2007 at University of Ulster, Coleraine, Northern Ireland, organised by John Gillespie. A selection of papers from the conference was published in Re*CALL* volume 20. This year's conference featured a bigger and improved virtual strand, first introduced in 2007. This was once again, coordinated by Lesley Shield and Peppi Taalas.

The Annual EUROCALL Research Award

The recipient of the Annual EUROCALL Research Award for 2007 was Tatsuya Nakata, The University of Tokyo Graduate School of Arts and Sciences, Japan. This award includes publication in Re*CALL* Journal, attendance at the annual conference and a year's membership of the Association.

The János Kohn Scholarship

There had been no submissions for the János Kohn Scholarship for 2007. However, the 2006 winner, Besa Pupa of Kosovo, was in attendance at EUROCALL 2007 in Coleraine, N. Ireland.
