

# EUROCALL Annual Report 1999/00

## Headquarters and secretariat

EUROCALL continued to operate from the Language Institute at the University of Hull. The former CTI Centre for Modern Languages became part of a much larger Subject Centre for Languages, Linguistics and Area Studies, in turn part of the Learning and Teaching Support Network (LTSN) funded by the UK Higher Education funding bodies. The team at Hull is responsible for aspects of the Centre's activities relating to communication and information technologies (C&IT), and consists of June Thompson, Fred Riley and Julie Venner who serves as EUROCALL membership secretary. We were pleased to be joined in May 2000 by Janet Bartle who is the Academic Co-ordinator, C&IT for the Subject Centre.

## Executive Committee

Members of the Executive Committee for the period in question are listed below. Members of the Committee attend two meetings a year, normally at the expense of their own institution but with assistance from EUROCALL if they have no other source of funding. In between meetings, discussion is carried out through a closed e-mail discussion list. ### Membership

Total membership of EUROCALL remained virtually static, at 438. This was the second year following the introduction of recruitment of members via the annual conference, and the rate of retention of these new members is an issue being addressed by the Executive Committee. The table below gives a breakdown of the countries represented. EUROCALL continues to operate a reciprocal arrangement with affiliated associations such as CALICO, so that members of these associations are entitled to certain EUROCALL benefits and vice-versa.

## **Finance**

Income of £20,000 in membership fees and £4,500 in profits from the Besançon conference meant that there was a surplus of £6,696 over the year. This was carried forward to bring the total held in reserve to £34,419. However, this figure did not reflect the true picture as the costs of *ReCALL* Vol 12, for the calendar year 2000, were not included due to the different accounting periods of EUROCALL and Cambridge University Press. An operating deficit of £2,600 was thus budgeted for the financial year 2000/2001.

## **Publication**

During this year, members received two issues of *ReCALL* as usual, but the calendar year 2000 marked the start of an arrangement whereby Cambridge University Press publishes *ReCALL* on behalf of EUROCALL. Thus, Volume 12 Part 1, May 2000 appeared in a new format. EUROCALL members will also have electronic access by password to *ReCALL* via CUP Journals Online.

CUP are investing considerably in the marketing of *ReCALL* through library subscriptions, and it is hoped that this partnership with a prestigious publisher will benefit EUROCALL and increase the circulation of *ReCALL*, as well as continuing to improve the quality of its content. A new Editorial Board was established in advance of the new arrangement. This comprises:

## **Information service**

### *Enquiries and visitors*

Over the year, the Hull team dealt with 65 enquiries from EUROCALL members and received 10 visitors who spent time, usually relating to their research, examining software and publications in the dedicated CALL libraries held at Hull.

### *Discussion list*

Approximately 230 members were registered as users of the discussion list. Much of the material posted to the list related to the provision of information. There were a few instances where the list was used for the promotion of commercial services or products, which is not to be encouraged. However, it is felt that the disadvantages of the occasional misuse of the list are outweighed by the fact that the list is 'open', without the need for a moderator.

### *Website*

The EUROCALL website acquired the new domain name of **www.eurocall.org** and since the departure of Kylie Baxter has been maintained by Fred Riley. Templates were provided so that the designers of national/regional EUROCALL websites could maintain the EUROCALL house-style. Since the new association with the LTSN Subject Centre, EUROCALL members now have direct access to a wider range of language-related information via the EUROCALL website.

### **Regional representatives**

The list of national / regional representatives, who act as contacts in their own particular regions, to stimulate relevant activity locally and to promote membership of EUROCALL, has gradually expanded. Françoise Blin was succeeded as Co-ordinator by Stephan Pohlmann who was elected to serve for the year 1999/2000. Communication takes place via a dedicated discussion list and progress has been made in establishing local websites. The representatives meet annually at the conference to share ideas, and the Co-ordinator of the representatives is co-opted onto the EUROCALL Executive Committee as an observer.

### **Conference**

A highly successful annual conference was held at the Université de Franche-Comté, Besançon, organised by Thierry Chanier. The quality of presentations was generally thought to be high, and a selection of these was published in *ReCALL* volume 12 part 1, May 1999, the first issue published by Cambridge University Press, comprising 120 pages.

### **Research**

The Joint Policy Statement, formulated in the previous year, was translated and adapted for use in different regional contexts. The statement is available to EUROCALL members at [http://www.hull.ac.uk/cti/eurocall/research\\_policy.htm](http://www.hull.ac.uk/cti/eurocall/research_policy.htm)

In order to encourage newcomers to research in the area of CALL and TELL, the Executive Committee held discussions resulting in the establishment of an annual EUROCALL Research Award, to be awarded for the first time in 2001.

### **Special Interest Groups**

The InSTIL SIG has become well-established, with a successful pre-conference workshop held in Besançon. Full information may be found at the website <http://dbs.tay.ac.uk/instil/>. A new SIG in Language Processing was instigated during this year and a website for the group is under development.

### **The János Kohn Scholarship**

The new scholarship to commemorate the name of Janos Kohn was advertised during the year. The scholarship enables a young Hungarian teacher or researcher to participate in a EUROCALL conference by providing funds to cover travel costs to and from the conference, accommodation and meals at the conference, and the registration fee. There were four applicants in 1999/2000 and the scholarship was awarded to Peter Gal from the University of Veszprem, for attendance at EUROCALL 2000 in Dundee.

### **Affiliations**

Contact with major national and international associations such as CALICO, IALL and ATELL has been maintained and strengthened. A preliminary meeting was held in Besançon in September 1999 with a view to working towards a second WorldCALL conference in 2003. EUROCALL's membership of the European Languages Council also continues.
